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A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Greetings from the cold & snow! Embracing the extremely important "parent hat," I find myself at Pali Retreat Center (great venue!) chaperoning for the Pacific Symphony Youth Wind Ensemble's Winter Retreat. The first piece rehearsed this morning was Lauridsen's "O Magnum Mysterium," arranged for wind ensemble. Dr. Whitmore's attention to detail in facilitating the instrumentalist's understanding of representing the artistry expected in this work, but without the use of the famous text, was inspiring.

Listening to this piece brings forward a strong emotional response, and as the instrumentalists learned to connect with and beautifully represent the piece, it reminded me of how music can so quickly alter emotions, minds, souls, spirits, hearts, lives and the trajectory of those future adults we see each day in our classrooms. We implicitly understand that music changes lives. Often the making of music is enough. However, many students entering our classrooms are walking through immense personal trauma, impacting their performance in all classrooms as well as have long term consequences through adulthood. Consider...

abuse (emotional, psychological, physical, sexual) | anxiety | bullying | death | disasters (natural/manmade) | divorce | deportation | neglect | terrorism | trauma (family, medical, etc.) | traumatic grief | violence (community/domestic/gun/school)

Brene Brown, in her most recent book "Dare to Lead," reminds teachers that "...what we are ethically called to do, is create a space in our schools and classrooms where all students can walk in and, for that day or hour, take off the crushing weight of their armor, hang it on a rack, and open their heart to truly being seen. We must be guardians of a space that allows students to breathe and be curious and explore the world....We should never underestimate the benefit to a child of having a place to belong – even one – where they can take off their armor. It can and often does change the trajectory of their life."

Please consider the potential – of what might happen through creating a sense of safety, as well as building in opportunities to develop self-regulation techniques and peer/team builder experiences while walking purposely towards the level of choral excellence desired. Here are some ideas, and please let me know what happens!

- <u>1 Create a sense of safety...</u> address grudges early on, admit you are fallible, build a positive atmosphere, develop non-negotiables, find time for quiet moments, focus on building community all year, follow through with consequences, give kids a chance to problem solve on their own, implement consistent schedules & teacher behaviors, make eye contact & smile often, model vulnerability, offer options, remain calm always, represent kindness and patience constantly, sit/sing/laugh with your students.
- <u>2 Develop their ability to self-regulate by utilizing...</u> breathing exercises, brain breaks, check-ins, SMART goals for students, discussions of potentially difficult scenarios, instilling self-awareness, isolating the desired skills and providing practice, mindfulness & meditation, movement activities, self-esteem builders, self-reflection activities, an emotions scale.
- <u>3 Build their sense of "team."</u> Choral singing is, inherently, team building. Consider, however, the possibility that additional team/peer building activities might be in order. You might take advantage of games that alleviate tension, build community, encourage continuous growth, improve positivity, and/or focus on communication.



Coffee and Choral Music

As a prolific coffee drinker I will be one of the first to let you know that Finnish people drink more coffee per capita than anyone in the world. However, coffee aside, they also have a strong body of choral works that are worth considering for your choirs. A few years ago, I had the privilege of traveling to Finland to meet a few of their choral musicians and composers. If you want to hear more about Finnish music in depth, I would be glad to share with you over a cuppa. For now, here are a few composers and pieces I discovered on my trip.

Jean Sibelius has two short accessible pieces for your intermediate choirs that can help explore rich Romantic sonorities. Saarella Palaa and Sydämeni Laulu are two of my favorites for mixed or tenorbass choirs. Auringon Noustessa by Toivo Kuula is absolutely gorgeous for choirs with enough singers to pull off the 8-part divisi. Pekka Kostiainen is considered the Finnish "Tormis" with his folk inspired works such as Noita Laulan. His Latin piece Spes Est! is an interesting composition for treble choirs. Einojuhani Rautavaara's Lapsimessu (A Children's Mass) is somewhat challenging, but doable for your SSA treble choirs. Bengt Johansson wrote his Examine Me for advanced treble choirs and Ione, Dead the Long Year is a beautiful and accessible polytonal piece in six parts for your mixed choirs. If you're looking for interesting and rhythmic songs, you can't beat the music of Mia Makaroff. Not only is Butterfly stunning, but You Can't Stop Me! and Mita Kaikatavat Kivonen are great fun as well. Lastly, if you need help with Finnish pronunciation, Jaakko Mäntyjärvi wrote Sing it in Finnish: a practical pronunciation guide for singers and choral directors published by Sulasol. He also has some great choral pieces as well!

I could go on for pages about this subject (I did write a Master's thesis on Finnish choral music a while ago), but I hope this piques your interest in exploring the culture of Finland through music. Let me know if you decide to perform any of these pieces with your choirs or if you want to meet up for that coffee and discussion.

She completed her BA at UCLA and earned an MA in English from CSU Northridge, during which time she and her husband opened the Santa Monica Academy of Music. She also codirects the all-district honor choir and is the Director of Elemental Choir, the choral component of a local non-profit organization, Elemental Music.

KNOW YOUR CHORAL COMMUNITY

What would you say are your strengths as a teacher?

I would say that among my dedication to selecting the appropriate level of choral literature for all of my groups and my initial studies as a piano major, one other strength that has served me well in all of the different programs I have directed is my firm belief that singing, and especially singing in choir, is uplifting emotionally, and builds character through its emphasis on teamwork and full participation, no matter the level of the group.

What is one of your favorite activities with your students?

Meeting my students on their first day of choir and seeing their faces as they hear how great they sound as a group. For many, my class is the first time anyone has really showed them how their voice can be an instrument.

What are some of your favorite, go-to pieces for your choris?

Doreen Rao; Fifty Nifty United States, 2-part, Ray Charles; Blackbird, John Lennon and Paul McCartney, 2-part arr. Audrey Snyder; Si Cantemo-Round; Shake the Papaya Down-arr. Ruth Dwyer and Judith Waller-3 part

Give a shout out to a choral colleague who inspires you.

I am inspired by all of my choral colleagues in SMMUSD. But I am particularly inspired by my elementary choral colleague, Susan Justin. She is a master at reaching as many of her young (4th-5th grade) singers as possible through age-appropriate literature, and fun approaches to both technique and literacy. Her incorporation of general music concepts makes scaffolding her choral techniques easier for the young singers, and she is a very talented collaborative pianist as well!

Website Questions & Answers

Q: What information is available in the Members-Only area of the SCVA website? **A:** Here's a partial list of the really cool things you can do:

- View all of your Festival Host Registrations
- View all of your Festival Participant Registrations and their payment status
- Print an invoice for a Festival Registration
- Change the Sight-Reading Level and/or Voicing for a Festival (up to 2 weeks prior to the festival)
- Download and view the presentations from Fall In-Service sessions over the last few years

Q: How can I save money when using PayPal to pay for multiple items?

A: If you are adding the same kind of payment for multiple students, don't add one line-item to your shopping cart for each student. Instead, add a single line-item and then set the quantity to the number of students (and enter all singers' names together). This will save you a whopping \$0.30 off the second and subsequent singers. It all adds up.

Q: How can I update my membership information or change my e-mail address if I change schools?

A: Simply pretend you are renewing your membership by clicking on the "Join/Renew" link in the upper-right corner of the website, and then update whatever information you need, including changing your e-mail address if necessary. If you have already paid your current year membership dues, you can ignore the second page that allows you to pay on-line through PayPal.

Q: If I reply directly to a broadcast message that comes from **admin@scvachoral.org**, will the original sender of that message receive it?

A: Seriously?!? Have you not been reading my articles in previous newsletters? Have you overlooked the sentence in those messages that states "**do not reply to this message**"? The answer is a resounding **NO**. If you continue to reply directly to those messages, I will remotely infect your computer speakers so they can only play "*Dancing Queen*" from ABBA over and over again.
