A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Karen Garrett

We are the Music Makers.....

It is a great responsibility to mold the next generation of *Music Makers* and yet choral directors fearlessly take on the challenge daily. Each one of us must be knowledgeable about: diction, choral music history, sight reading, foreign language, piano playing, being a skilled organizer, an inspiring leader, voice instructor, master teacher, coach, financial wizard, music technology geek, recruiter, etc. The list of required skills to build a successful choir program is endless. When people ask me if there is one choral skill more important than any other that a choral teacher must possess– I reply, "You must teach them to SING." In most school choral programs the choir director is the ONLY voice instructor the child will ever meet. To that end we must prepare ourselves with the most up-to-date knowledge to mold voices in a healthy and age appropriate way. But we all lack depth of knowledge in something, so what if you were not a vocal performance major, haven't taken lessons or pedagogy classes in years or don't have much solo experience? No problem, time to learn. Here is a list of ideas and resources to add to your voice building tool kit.

Resources and Ideas:

- Books: <u>Choral Contabile</u> by Katherarine Rundus Choral Pedagogy by Brenda Smith and Robert Sataloff
- Contact a respected vocal instructor from the local college/university to do a clinic with your students. Be sure they have had experience with your choirs' age group.
- Attend In-Services sponsored by SCVA, ACDA or CASMEC with sessions on Choral Tone and/or Vocal Production. Take copious notes and try new techniques. Listen, listen, listen to what your singers are telling you.
- Attend concerts and LISTEN. Ask choir directors that you respect how that get that tone.

It has taken me years to develop techniques to help my singers. Mostly I watch and listen to experienced voice teachers and ask LOTS of questions. I also listen to my best teachers - the students. I listen for free and easy singing and reinforce good habits and techniques.

I heard some AMAZING choral singing at the Sr. High Honor Choir concert. What a pleasure to hear three choirs of mind blowing ability sing such sensitive and meaningful literature. Thank you to Crystal Stone and Matt Netto for an amazing evening.

Another opportunity for feedback for vocal production is the Solo Vocal Competition and Ensemble Festival. Deadline for application is January 8th, 2018. Students who sing receive a clinic from a knowledgeable and encouraging voice clinician – sign up today.

So...... have you signed up for a choral festival yet? Committed to attending a sight-reading festival? Take the plunge – your singers will thank you for the opportunity and you will learn so much as an educator. SCVA offers more adjudicated choral festival than any organization in the state of California.

We are the Music Makers......and the molders of future singers. Let's give them all they deserve.

An energetic group of past, present, and future choral educators gathered in Pasadena on Friday, October 20 for

the annual SCVA Fall In-Service. What a spectacularly relevant and inspiring day it was!

Dr. Joshua Palkki did the lion's share of work. His energetic, vibrant approach, wrapped in solid, useful pedagogy, was a smash hit. His compelling and informative sessions were designed to empower a greater understanding of Common Core components and how they might be effectively addressed in the typical choral rehearsal. *Common Core in Choir: How Does it Apply* was replete with useful educational instruction tips. *Score Study and Lesson Planning: Peas in a Pod* underscored how both are non-linear processes that can foster imaginative teaching strategies in the choral rehearsal. And Dr. Palkki's session on *Gender and Sexuality in Choral Music Education* as



well as his *Social Justice-Themed Reading Session* both poignantly reminded us that the complex role of the choral educator must be compassionate, continually adaptive, and life-affirming.



In her two, break-out session, Stephanie Grogg, Elementary Classroom Resource VAPA Resource Specialist for Clovis Unified School District, shed light on how the *Common Core and California* standards for Classroom Music, Technology, and Choral Ensembles can positively impact rehearsals for K-8 choral music students. Her stimulating, spirited approach and comprehensive knowledge of educational trends impressed and inspired all in attendance.
